In addition, all Connecticut residents have access to the statewide library service, including Interlibrary Loan.

Charter Oak uses several standardized exams to test the proficiency of its students. The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) tests are administered for basic courses and the

Graduate Record Examinations (GRE) for more advanced study. The tests are given regularly in testing centers throughout the state.
